SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- Manuscripts must be original, unpublished, and not under consideration elsewhere.
- Word limit: 6,000 words maximum, inclusive of footnotes.
- All submissions must include an abstract of no more than 250 words outlining the background, objectives, core argument, relevance to contemporary legal issues, findings and recommendations.
- Text must be written in UK English (except for quoted material). Non-English terms should be italicized.
- Referencing must comply with the NALT Guidelines for Referencing using automatically generated footnotes (10-point font), not endnotes.
- All manuscripts undergo rigorous double-anonymous peer review and plagiarism screening via plagiarism tools.
- Submissions must be in Microsoft Word format and include a title page with author name(s), institutional affiliation(s), contact email, and telephone number.
