

**EXTRACTS OF THE RESOLUTIONS REACHED BY THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL
EDUCATION AT ITS QUARTERLY MEETING OF AUGUST 01, 2025**

The third quarterly meeting of the Council of Legal Education (CLE) for the year 2025 took place on **Friday 1st of August, 2025** at the Council's Chambers, Nigerian Law School Headquarters, Bwari, Abuja, under the distinguished Chairmanship of Chief Emeka Ngige, SAN, OFR, Life Bencher.

At the end of the meeting, the following were amongst the resolutions adopted:

1. Approval of the February 2024/2025 (Backlog) Bar Final Examination Results.

A total of **5,674** students participated. The breakdown of the results is as follows:

- a) First Class – 72 representing 1.3% of the participants.
- b) Second Class Upper Division – 608 representing 10.7% of the participants.
- c) Second Class Lower Division – 2,098 representing 37.0% of the participants
- d) Pass – 1,650 representing 29.1% of the participants.
- e) Conditional Pass – 229 representing 4.0% of the participants
- f) Fail – 994 representing 17.5% of the participants
- g) Absent – 23 representing 0.4% of the participants

2. Accreditation Reports

The Accreditation/ Facilities Verification Reports presented by the Board of Studies chaired by the Director-General, Prof Isa Hayatu Chiroma, SAN, Life Bencher, were approved by the Council as follows:

- a) The Federal University Lokoja, Kogi State, was given approval to commence law degree programme with a quota of fifty (50) students at the 100 level. The university would be revisited by the Accreditation team at the appropriate time.
- b) Salem University, Lokoja, Kogi State was directed to continue to upgrade the facilities in the faculty of Law. The Council would revisit the University at the appropriate time.

- c) The following Universities who had applied for consideration of commencing the law degree programme were advised to address deficiencies in their faculties of law and reinvite the Council once they are rectified:
- i. Confluence University of Science and Technology, Osara, Kogi State;
 - ii. Ibrahim Badamasi Babangida University, Lapai, Niger State.
- d) Council approved different sanctions for Universities that admitted students before Council's approval as follows:
- i. Glorious Vision University, Ogwa, Edo State, two (2) year moratorium.
 - ii. Renaissance University, Ugbawka, Enugu State, one (1) year moratorium.

3. Examination Misconduct and Admissions Cases

The Council approved various sanctions on Examination Misconduct and Referred Admission Cases referred to it by the Board of Studies, in line with the Rules and Regulations.

4. Financial Report

The Council approved the following reports presented by the Finance and General Purpose Committee:

- a) The Audited Financial Statement for the Year 2020 – 2023
- b) Capital Projects for 2024/2025

5. Appreciation

The Chairman commended Council members for their contributions and expressed appreciation to the Director-General, Management, and staff for their commitment and support.
